Continuous Program messaging from The Challenge Program to businesses, educators and students, and the advancement of involving <u>all</u> students to compete for awards, <u>regardless</u> of previous academic performance, are vital components implemented in each school.

PROGRAM ACTIVITY - FALL

A TCP Kick-Off Assembly introduces The Challenge Program, Inc. and the business partner to your students in grades 10, 11, 12 and how to win an award worth \$200 in each category. These assemblies occur each fall.

Your school will receive five posters representing each award category. You will also receive a banner announcing the school's Business Partner. *Please* hang the posters and banner prominently around the school.

For New Schools: The fall assembly involves only the Kick-Off presentation.

For Currently Participating Schools: Awards for the *current juniors and seniors* will be presented for the work they achieved *last year as* sophomores and juniors. (i.e., 2014-2015 sophomore/junior awards will be presented during the 2015 fall kick-off assembly).

PROGRAM ACTIVITY - SPRING

The Challenge Program, Inc. and the Business Partner present the graduating Senior Class their awards in the spring prior to graduation. TCP prefers to attend *your school's pre-set annual Senior Awards Program*. However, another time can be arranged.

We are aware many of these programs take place in the evenings or on weekends and at locations other than the school premises. Just tell us where and when and we'll be there.

If it is not convenient for The Challenge Program to attend your Senior Program, we will make other arrangements with you to visit your seniors prior to graduation and present their awards to them.

- Schedule the Date/Time for your Senior Program, or other arrangement, when you are contacted by The Challenge Program.
- Please place TCP as close to the top of the community awards section of your program as much as possible.

STUDENT AND EDUCATOR SURVEYS

"How do you know the program works?"

We respect your busy schedule, however we ask you to take the time to have the students (and you) complete these surveys. We will always email you the links you need to complete these surveys.

STUDENT SURVEY

Please click on <u>Survey Forms</u> where you will find Printable Survey Sheets to distribute to your students. We will also forward a hard copy of the Survey Forms.

- Give each Finalist one slip to take the survey.
- Instruct students to follow the links provided to you **and** on the survey sheets to take the survey.
- If Finalists are using a common computer, clear the cookies before the next Finalist uses that computer.
- After the Finalist completes the survey, a pass code will pop up.
- Finalists should fill out the slip *including* the pass code and return it to you.
- Finalists only need to take the survey once, even if they are eligible for more than one award.
- If a student is eligible for more than one award, duplicate the slip after they have returned it to you.
- The slip is used for the lottery drawing as needed for the appropriate award category/ categories.

EDUCATOR SURVEY

Once a year you will receive an email with a link to a short survey.

No slips – No passcodes!

PROCESS AND PROCEDURES FOR ALL AWARD CATEGORIES

TCP is obligated to distribute all 15 award checks to each school.

Schedule of Awards distribution for the upcoming 2015-2016 Program Year as follows:

- 2016 Graduating Seniors will receive their awards in the spring of 2016 prior to graduation.
- 2015-2016 10th & 11th grade students will receive their awards in the <u>Fall of 2016</u>
- 1. Educators responsible for the facilitation of The Challenge Program within their schools will receive, via email, links for the TCP **Online Survey** and for the TCP **Online Award Form**.
- 2. The Survey is the final step in eligibility to win an award.
- 3. <u>Survey Slips</u> should be distributed to <u>as many finalists</u> as there happen to be for each category even if there is only one.
- 4. Direct Finalists to take the TCP <u>Online Survey</u>. Slips should be returned to the school official to complete eligibility. Seniors should do this step <u>after the 3rd Quarter</u> to complete eligibility and Underclassmen should do this step <u>in the fall</u> to complete eligibility.
- 5. The returned survey slips should be placed in a lottery. (If a student is eligible for more than one award, duplicate the survey slip after it has been turned in and use for other drawings. Students take the survey **only once**.)
- 6. The lottery drawing may take place in front of all Finalists who completed the survey. (It is at the sole discretion of the school whether or not to reveal the winner's name at this point.)
- 7. Winners names should be entered into and submitted through a TCP Senior, Junior or Sophomore ONLINE Award Form.
- 8. Winners will be awarded their checks during a school presentation by TCP and the school business sponsor.
 - Seniors in the spring prior to graduation.
 - Underclassmen the following fall.

CRITERIA FOR INDIVIDUAL AWARDS

TCP is obligated to distribute all 15 award checks to each school.

ATTENDANCE

ELIGIBILITY will begin with the KICK-OFF ASSEMBLY UNLESS OTHERWISE STATED by the school.

FINALIST(S) are drawn from students with "0" absences. If no one has "0" Absences – draw from those with the least number of absences according to school policy. They will become FINALISTS.

STEM - Science, Technology, Engineering, Math

AVTS/CTC SCHOOLS: Classes which involve any form of the above subject matter.

HIGH SCHOOL: Classes of ALL ACADEMIC LEVELS - introductory to advanced - should be included.

FINALISTS are the #1 ranked student from every included class. (included classes are up to each school).

COMMUNITY SERVICE

SERVICE FORMS are for your convenience. An award MUST BE DISTRIBUTED even if no forms are submitted. FINALISTS are among the students who submitted the top 10% of hours for the year.

ACADEMIC IMPROVEMENT

GREATEST INCREASE IN YEAR ENDING TO YEAR ENDING G.P.A. regardless of beginning grade level. FINALISTS are drawn from among the top 10% of students with the greatest increase in G.P.A.

ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE

HIGHEST OVERALL G.P.A. from the beginning to the end of the current school year.

FINALISTS are drawn from among the top 10% of students with the highest overall G.P.A.

Choosing a winner via lottery may mean and should be reiterated to students that the student at the very top of any category may or may not be the final winner.

PROGRAM REVIEW

- All 15 Awards must be distributed.
- All ties should be broken via lottery. We are unable to split or duplicate an award.
- > ONLY THE TCP ONLINE AWARD FORMS MAY BE USED.
- > The Surveys are important. Please leave time. Thank you in advance.
- Monthly Announcements, Website Features and Quarterly Newsletters are emailed and online.
- > Senior attendance, grades and community service are calculated 1st through 3rd Quarter.
- Underclassmen attendance, grades and community service are calculated 1st through 4th Quarter.
- Community Service awards must be distributed whether or not forms are submitted.
- Using a lottery system means the very top student in any category may/may not be the final winner.

The award criteria in this document are meant to guide you through the program and award process.

Final determination regarding a winner is at the sole discretion of school policy.

These guidelines, however, have proven successful and it is our recommendation to follow them as closely as possible.
